Ebru Varol: *Reveries*

February 29 - March 12

Artist Ebru Varol presents her first solo exhibition of photography in New York City this month in the Gregg Galleries. The exhibition's title, *Reveries*, is a reflection on the creative process used by the photographer during her wanderings around urban streets and nature's paths.

Ebru Varol follows a tradition of evocative photography upheld by André Kertész and Eugène Atget in her ability to capture ordinary life unfolding around her while at the same time challenging concepts of illusion and consciousness. Varol's imagery aesthetically shifts from black and white to color and conceptually from the candid to the meditative. The power of the senses is also an enhancing force that gives her work unique texture and atmosphere.

Ebru Varol has spent most of her life in three cities, on three different continents: Istanbul, London, and New York. These places constantly inform her work and blend into one imaginative voice. Her work has been exhibited in Paris, London and Basel.
